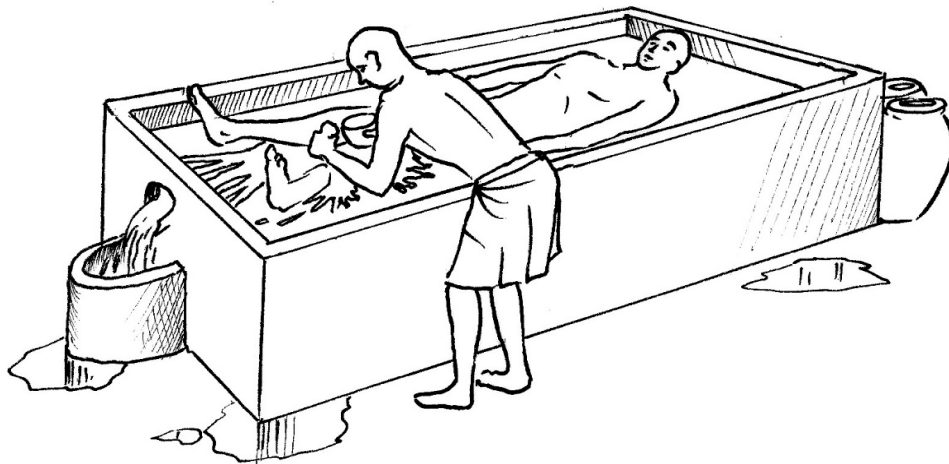




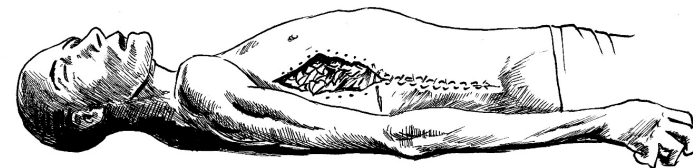
THE DEATH OF A PHARAOH, MUMMIFICATION and BURIAL

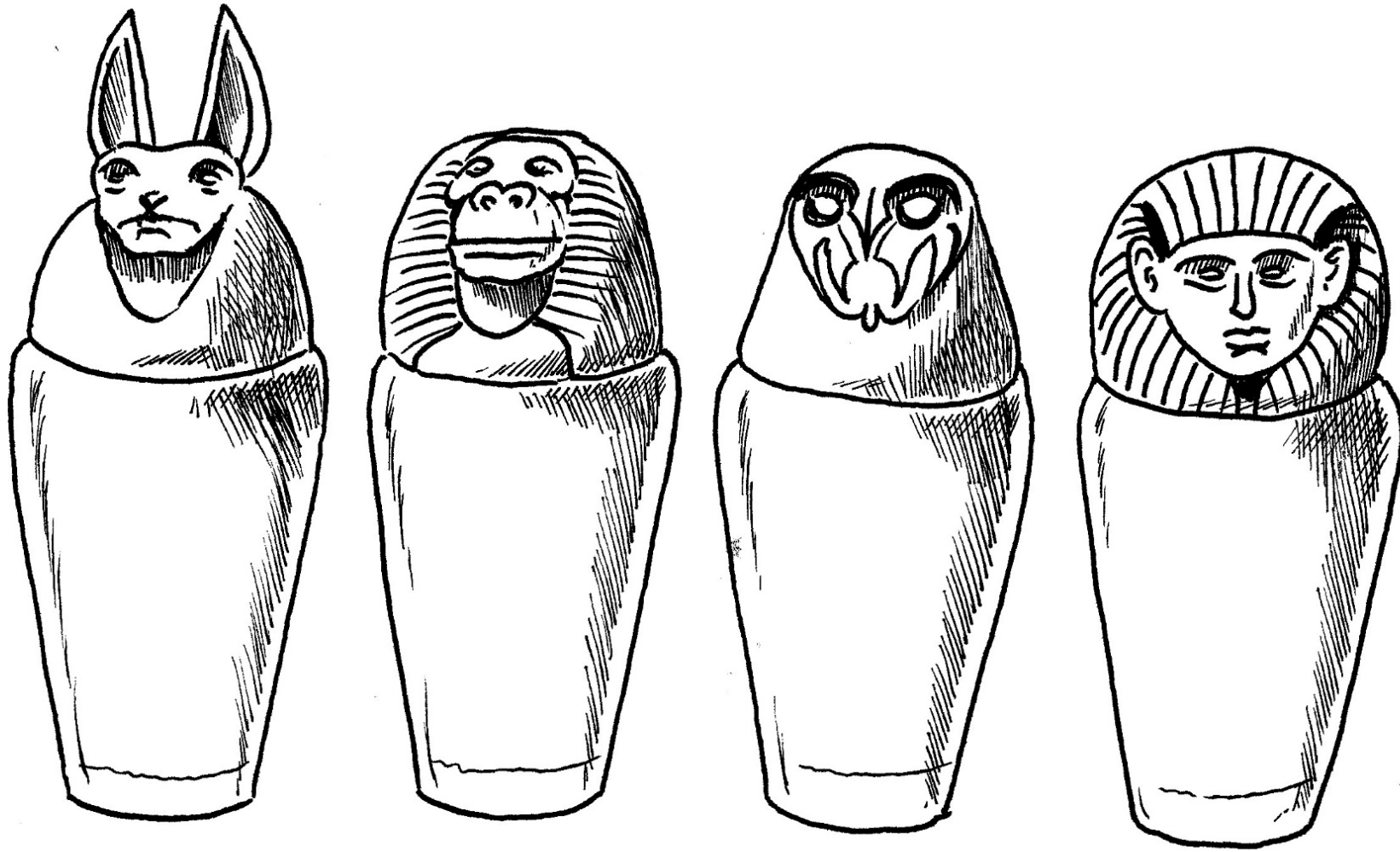
When a pharaoh died, **special priests** started to **prepare his body for burial**. This process took **70 days**.



The priests washed the body with Nile water and wine.

The pharaoh's brain and internal organs were removed and put in **CANOPIC JARS**

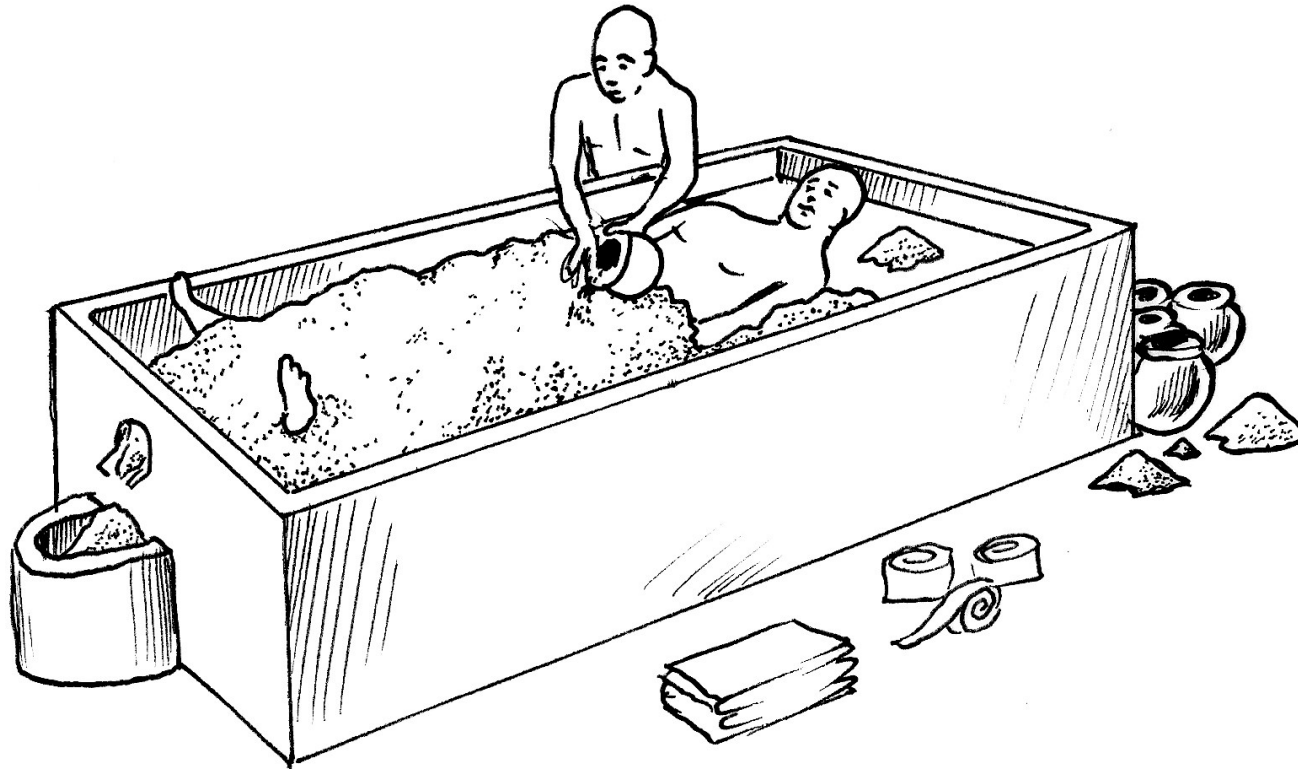




CANOPIC JARS

The body was then **stuffed with NATRON** which **helped to dry and preserve the body**.

The body was left for **40 days**.

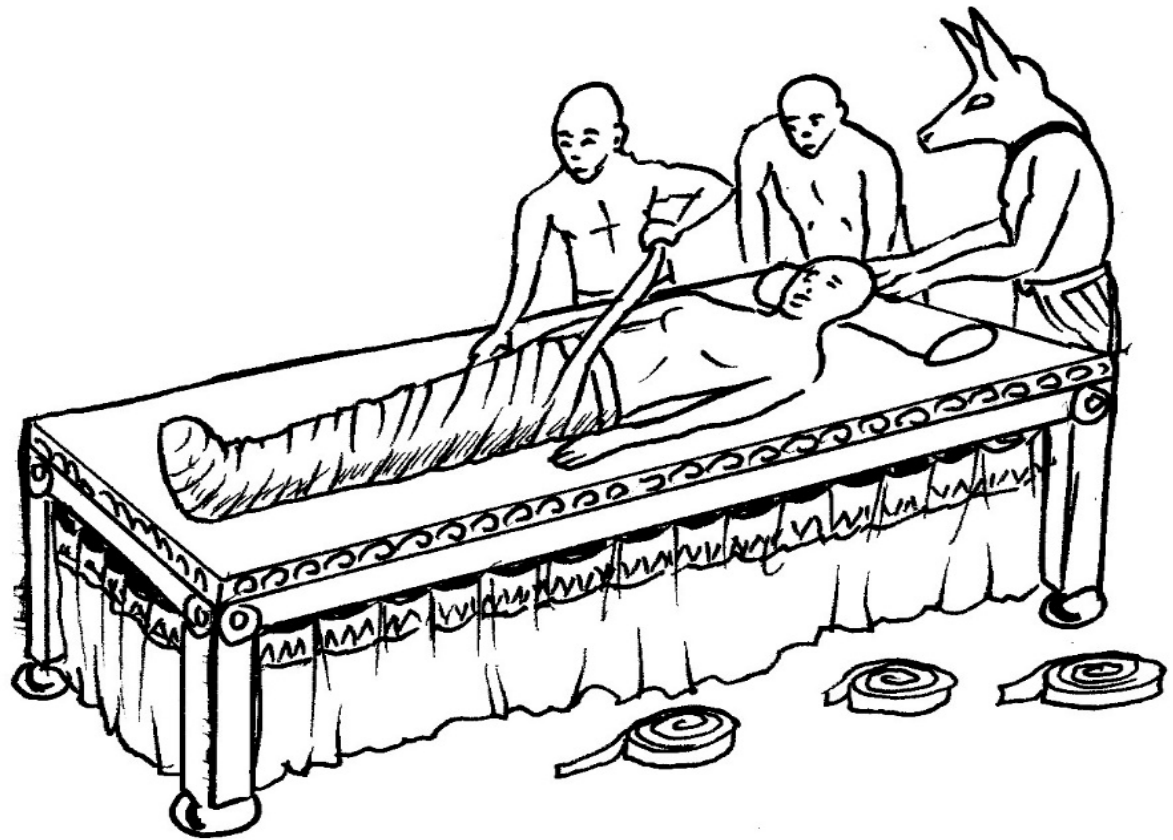


The priests **removed the NATRON**, washed the body in Nile water again. The body was coated with perfumes and oils to make it smell nice and stuffed with leaves and linen to fill up the holes.



A priest dressed as the god ANUBIS touched the Pharaohs mouth with farm tool called an adze. Egyptians believed this would return all the senses the pharaoh had in life.

The pharaoh would then be wrapped in **linen bandages** in very fancy patterns.



The Pharaoh was placed in his **sarcophagus** ready to enter his tomb.
